Screening and Selection Criteria for various Teaching Positions

(In accordance with Governor Secretariat, U.P. Order Nos. 3019/32-G.S./2020 dt. 18.05.2021; E-4229/G.S. dt. 02.07.2021 E-5862/G.S dt. 03.09.2021 and UGC-Regulations 2018)

A candidate will be considered for the merit indexing for the vacant teaching positions only when he/she fulfills the minimum eligibility requirements for post of Assistant Professor/ Associate Professor/ Professor (as applicable) as per AICTE Gazette notification 2019.

The details of the weightage/points to be assigned for various components/criteria for recruitment to various teaching positions are given in Table-I and Table-II below.

Assistant Professor

- a) The selection process shall be conducted in two parts (i) short-listing based on the marks obtained in written test and API & basic Academic Score and (ii) Assessment of teaching skills and interview. A merit list shall be prepared by the Controller of Examination based on the combined score of 'Basic Academic Score and API score' as per Table-III AND 'Written Test'. From this merit list appropriate number of candidates (10 candidates against the first vacancy and thereafter 05 candidates for each incremental vacancy) will be called for assessment of teaching skills and interview.
- b) Only those candidates will be called for the interview who get shortlisted on the basis

of the merit prepared from the marks obtained as per the Table-I.

- c) The final selection will be Exclusively based upon the marks obtained in Table-II.
- d) The committee will calculate the 'Basic Academic Score and API score' in accordance with UGC regulations 2018.
- e) There shall be a written objective examination of the relevant discipline/branch of 40 marks.
- f) The syllabi for written examination, in sciences/ humanities & social sciences will be syllabi of NET and in Engineering/technology will be syllabi of GATE.
- g) The candidates shall be intimated about his/her aggregate for Basic Academic score and Research score through Institute website. Candidates will be given a time of at least seven days from the date of such intimation to file representation with respect to the calculation of above mentioned score for inviting objections, if any.
- h) If objection from any candidate is received within the above mentioned time limit, Objection received will be resolved and communicated back.
- i) The written examination (Objective type) will be conducted. The answer key of the written examination will be published on the Institute website and will be available to the candidate for browsing after the examination.
- j) As per the AICTE letter No. 27/P&AP/PAY/01/2021-22/35(OCT) dated 28/10/2021, a relaxation of 5% shall be allowed at the Bachelor's as well as at the Master's level for the candidates belonging to Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe/Other Backward Classes(OBC)(Non-creamy Layer)/EBC/PWD/WOMEN.
- k) The candidate will be intimated about his/her score of written examination through institute website. The candidates shall be given a time of at least three days from the date of publication of written examination score, for inviting objections. If objections from any candidate is received within the above mentioned time limit, the office of examination controller will address the objections received from the candidate and ensure the publication of revised result.
- I) A merit List shall be prepared by the Controller of Examination based on the combined score of 'Basic Academic Score and API score' AND 'written test'. From this merit list appropriate number of candidates (10 candidates against the first vacancy and thereafter five candidates for each incremental vacancy) will be called for assessment of teaching skills and interview.

Associate Professor and Professor

- m) The selection process shall be conducted in two parts: (i) Short-listing based on the marks obtained in API & Basic Academic Score and (ii) Interview. A merit list shall be prepared by controller of Examination based on the combined score of 'Basic Academic Score and API score' as per table-IV. From this merit list appropriate number of candidates (10 candidates against the first vacancy and thereafter 05 candidates for each incremental vacancy) will be called for interview.
- n) Only those candidates will be called for the interview who get shortlisted on the basis of the merit prepared from the marks obtained as per the Table-IV. The final Selection will be Exclusively based upon the marks obtained in Table-II.
- The 'Basic Academic Score and API score' shall be calculated by the committee as per UGC Regulation 2018.

- p) The candidate shall be intimated about his/her score through Institute website. He/She will be given time of at least seven days from the date of such intimation to file representation with respect to the calculation of above mentioned score for inviting objections, if any.
- q) If objection from any candidate is received within the above mentioned time limit, the objections will be resolved and communicated back.
- r) A 'Merit List' shall be prepared by the Controller of Examination based on the combined score of 'Basic Academic Score and API Score'. From this merit list appropriate number of candidates (10 candidates against the first vacancy and thereafter five candidates for each incremental vacancy) will be called for interview.

Peer-Reviewed or UGC-listed Journals (Impact factor to be determined as per ThomsonReuters list):

i)	Paper in refereed journals without imp	act factor -	5 Points
ii)	Paper with impact factor less than 1	-	10 Points
iii)	Paper with impact factor between 1 a	nd 2 -	15 Points
iv)	Paper with impact factor between 2 a	nd 5 -	20 Points
V)	Paper with impact factor between 5 a	nd 10 -	25 Points
vi)	Paper with impact factor >10	-	30 Points

(a) Two authors: 70% of total value of publication for each author.

(b) More than two authors: 70% of total value of publication for the First/Principal/Corresponding author and 30% of total value of publication for each of the joint authors.

Joint Projects: Principal Investigator and Co-investigator would get 50% each. **Note:**

- Paper presented if part of edited book or proceeding then it can be claimed only once.
- For joint supervision of research students, the formula shall be 70% of the total score for Supervisor and Co-supervisor. Supervisor and Co-supervisor, both shall get 7 marks each.
- *For the purpose of calculating research score of the teacher, the combined research score from the categories of 5(b). Policy Document and 6. Invited lectures/Resource Person/Paper presentation shall have an upper capping of thirty percent of the total research score of the teacher concerned.
- The research score shall be from the minimum of three categories out of six categories.
- The API/Research score secured -by candidates as per Table IV shall be scaled down to a maximum of 80.

Note: For the purpose of minimum essential qualification for the posts in subjects not covered/governed under UGC-Regulations, the regulations of their respectivegoverning bodies/statutory bodies shall be exercised.
